LEGISLATIVE NOTES Diane Diekman

The Department of Veterans Affairs has changed its motto to read, "To fulfill President Lincoln's promise to care for those who have served in our nation's military and for their families, caregivers, and survivors." It replaces the motto adopted in 1959, a decade after the Women's Armed Services Integration Act went into effect, that said, "To care for him" The VA released a study in 2020 that found women veterans were less likely to report feeling welcome at VA health care facilities—the same year then-VA Secretary Wilkie began installing plaques inscribed with the old motto at 142 VA-operated cemeteries nationwide. With Secretary McDonough's desire to make the agency a more inclusive place for veterans and employees, those plaques will now be replaced. -- Stars And Stripes

The **Military Spouse Hiring Act** has been introduced in the U.S. Senate and House to amend the Internal Revenue Code to grant a tax credit for hiring military spouses. Companies who hire veterans are already eligible for credits via the Work Opportunity Tax Credit program. *--Military Times*

Governor Kristi Noem signed the following bills passed by South Dakota's 98th Legislative Session: **HB 1039** increases National Guard tuition payments to 100%, **HR 1045** increases salaries for county veterans service officers, **HB 1046** provides tuition for families of National Guard members killed in line of duty, **HB 1054** provides \$100 for private headstones for veterans, **SB 13-14** provide funds for BG Dean Mann Readiness Center, and **SB 15** accepts military IDs for adding veteran designation to state licenses.
