I was a Post Commander for three years before moving to Sioux Falls, so I understand what is coming for the next year. My previous Post had 350 members and was not as active as Post 15. It will be a busy year following in John Bachmeier's and Bill Peters's footsteps.

We have a good slate of officers and executive board members for this coming year. Major emphasis will continue on increasing membership. We need to keep the Legion strong at all levels for greater impact when Legion national leaders testify before Congress to keep the promises made to military veterans. We need everybody to be a recruiter. This is not just a Post 15 priority; it is a national priority.

The second area of emphasis will be fundraising. Just like at home, money often goes out faster than it comes in. We need to support our programs that have been in place for decades (Boys State, baseball, shooting sports – if these are lost, they will never be replaced). More recently, we have increased our support of veterans in need, and family support events for deployed South Dakota Guard units. We must generate additional income to cover these costs. The Post investments are intended to help cover operating expenses in the future, based on interest income, but the stock market fluctuations the last few years have not provided the return on investment we hoped for. Our investment in the Alliance has yet to provide income to the Post (as expected by this point). Covid has had a definite negative impact. I ask each of you to help with these two objectives. LEGISLATIVE NOTES Diane Diekman

The Senate voted 66-30 to **repeal the Iraq war authorization** granted to President George W. Bush to invade Iraq in 2003. A repeal would help return warmaking powers to Congress and prevent future presidents from authorizing military intervention in the Middle East. The White House endorsed the repeal, noting that it would not affect the 2,500 U.S. troops currently stationed in Iraq. They are there under a separate 2001 military authorization to target al-Qaida in Afghanistan. The House still needs to pass the repeal before President Biden can sign it. *–Military Times*

Senator Tommy Tuberville from Alabama is delaying military promotions over the Pentagon's abortion policy. He is preventing confirmation for about 160 promotions to one-star general and admiral because the Defense Department recently announced travel and leave policies for troops seeking abortions. Tuberville's objection has thrown a wrench in what is usually a routine Senate maneuver in which hundreds of military nominations are confirmed all at once under a process known as unanimous consent. If Tuberville continues to hold out, the Senate would have to vote on nominations one at a time. --Military.com The Senate voted down Senator Tuberville's resolution to revoke VA Secretary Denis McDonough's seven-month-old policy that allows the VA to provide access to abortion counseling and abortions to pregnant veterans and VA beneficiaries in cases when life or health is endangered, or when the pregnancy is the result of rape or incest. Tuberville introduced his resolution under the Congressional Review Act, which gives Congress the authority to review major rules issued by federal agencies. -Stars & Stripes

21-Gun Salute vs. 3-Volley Rifle Salute

"The 21-gun salute is not to be confused with the three-volley salute (or three-rifle volley) rendered at military honors funerals," states The Arlington National Cemetery website.

The 21-gun salute is the highest honor a nation renders, usually reserved for national leaders and national flags. The custom stems from when warships would signify a lack of hostile intent by firing their cannons out to sea until all ammunition was spent. Gun salutes are by cannon or artillery and always in odd numbers.

Deceased veterans are honored by three volleys fired from rifles, not guns, by a funeral honor guard of three, five, or seven members. The three-volley tradition originates from when battles would be paused for both sides to clear their dead from the battlefield. When that task was completed, they fired three rifle volleys to signify the continuation of battle. – *Editor*
