Many Legion Posts have closed their bars, many more have closed due to financial hardship and lack of membership participation. This has happened in small communities and large cities. Today, we live in a very different world (post-Covid) than even five years ago. If Post 15 had not committed to being part of the Alliance (passed by Post 15 members by a very slim margin), there might not be a Post 15 today. There has been considerable give and take by both the Alliance and Post 15 to make this work. Some aspects of the Alliance agreements are working well, and some aspects have not met members' expectations. However, since this change, Post 15 has focused on the Legion Four Pillars of priorities instead of the bar and grill business. This has also changed our fundraising efforts and focus.

There were about 10 members who helped at the Fair. THANK YOU. Many of us worked every day at the fair. We recruited for the Legion, Auxiliary, Sons, Riders, and Singing Legionnaires. We gained some new family members for our efforts. The Auxiliary Golf Event was held August 15. Most teams were filled by area golfers, including two teams of Legion members. I hope the Auxiliary had a successful fundraising event.

The Hog Roast was also on August 15, with Auxiliary and Sons members helping. The event went much better than last year, we still had a few glitches, but the food and weather were excellent. We gained a few new members. Thanks to all who helped. Expenses were greater than income for this event as attendance was less than hoped for.

LEGISLATIVE NOTES

Congressional leaders are confident they can reach agreement on a compromise defense authorization bill later this year even though the House and Senate drafts differ significantly on a host of contentious social issues. The National Defense Authorization Act is considered must-pass legislation and has been passed out of Congress for 62 years. Senate lawmakers approved their \$886 billion version after more than a week of amendments work, which included new protections for military members from debt collectors and new limits on Chinese access to sensitive U.S. military technology. The final measure passed 86-11. The House authorization bill passed 219-210, largely along party lines. House Democrats don't want the amendments that repeal the Defense Department's abortion access policies, restrict medical care for transgender troops, eliminate military diversity initiatives, and ban the Pentagon from implementing climate change mitigation. Congressional leaders expect to sort out the competing drafts in interchamber negotiations. - Military Times
