Boys and Girls State applications are coming due, so please let your high school family members know about this unique opportunity to learn how our government works. We will soon start planning for the March Legion Birthday/Recognition dinner, and we need Educator, Law Enforcement, Firefighter, and Eagle Scout of the Year nominations.

2023 membership expired January 1. If you have not renewed, please do so. If you have supplemental insurance through the Legion, it expired at the end of the year if your dues are not current. National Legion dues will be increasing \$5/year for 2025. Post 15 voted to increase dues by \$5 to cover this increase. (See Adjutant column in this newsletter.) The portion the Post gets will support the Post for less than two months, so we continue to look for fundraising opportunities.

The Federal Government has been funding expanded high-speed internet service to rural areas. This has a direct impact on many of our fellow veterans, as rural health care access is increasingly internet-based. Education of our youth and development of economic opportunities in rural areas also depend on continued funding of the Affordable Connectivity Program. Please contact your federal and state elected officials and ask for their continued support of this program.

Greetings fellow Legionnaires! On Tuesday, December 12, several of us attended the Chamber of Commerce Mixer. We had a great showing of Legionnaires. Typically, Al and I attend these monthly events but this time we had Diane, Cal, Wayne, and even one of our newest members, Jon Theel. We met a lot of business leaders in the community, we sold raffle tickets, signed up Sons of the Legion, Auxiliary members, and even a new Legionnaire. The Mixer was held at the Giving Hope, Inc. Bingo Hall. Giving Hope is a non-profit organization that uses proceeds from its bingo operations to provide charitable gifts to organizations across Sioux Falls serving the needs of children in our community.

On December 13, I attended the Sioux Falls Veteran's Health Administration and Veteran's Benefits Administration monthly stakeholder's meeting. Presentations from representatives of the Community Care department reminded the audience to help educate our veterans on the need to keep the Community Care team informed of any and all appointments that may qualify for community care to make certain the visits are authorized. This will keep veterans from being charged for unauthorized visits to providers. It is best to contact Community Care at 605-333-6800, option 3, to make certain. We also heard from the Spinal Cord Injury team related to access to their specialized care programs. There are currently 76 individuals in the care programs. There was a presentation on services provided for residential care for substance abuse individuals. Care is voluntary and is for a period of 30 days followed by further social and clinical support. The success rate of this rehabilitation program is an extraordinary 42%. Outstanding!

Post 15 was invited to attend the annual State Veterans Affairs Volunteer Service [VAVS] Committee meeting via Zoom. Hospital Reps from Hot Springs, Ft. Meade, and Sioux Falls were in attendance. Topics discussed were upcoming holiday parties, needs of each facility, and the 2023 checking account balances. We also reviewed and approved the 2024 financial support for VAVS. SHOOTING SPORTS Lavry Fanning

BB GUN Orientation/Safety Class is January 6 at Humboldt Elementary School, with practice starting January 7 in Hartford. BB gun matches are March 6 at Spink County, March 16 at Pierre, March 23 at Lake County, April 13 at Hartford home range (Humboldt Sharpshooter Match), and the 4H State Tournament is April 26.

SPORTER AIR RIFLE has been practicing since October. Civilian Marksmanship Postal (CMP) #1 is January 15 and CMP #2 is April 11-13, both at Hartford. American Legion Postal is Feb 1.

Annual FUND Raiser (Soup Supper/ Silent Auction) for the Humboldt Sharpshooters in January 27 at St George Parish in Hartford. This is the major fund raiser for the Club and they could really use support from Post 15.

PRECISION AIR RIFLE Six members of this team recently shot in Colorado Springs in the 2024 Olympics Trials. All team members shot their personal best with a couple of shooters scoring 600 (all in the bullseye) or more out of a possible 650 (60 shots at 10 meters, all dead center in the bullseye). A 600 score causes college team coaches to start following shooters closely.

LEGISLATIVE NOTES Diane Diekman

Congress passed its \$874.2 billion National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for fiscal year 2024 on December 14 and sent it to the White House for President Biden's signature. Congress must still pass full spending bills for FY24 to fund the Defense Department and other agencies. Funding for military construction ends Jan. 19, and funds for the rest of the Defense Department expire Feb. 2. The Defense Department is currently operating under a stopgap funding bill, which means it can't start most new initiatives or move forward with many acquisitions authorized in the NDAA absent a full spending bill.

The American Legion opposes the PLUS (Preserving Lawful Utilization of Services for Veterans) Act, which would transition the system of securing benefits for disabled veterans to an unregulated profit-driven industry. The PLUS Act would allow automatic accreditation after 90 days regardless of whether VA has completed its verification process. The VA-accreditation program exists to ensure veterans and their family members receive appropriate representation on their VA benefits claims. The American Legion supports the Governing Unaccredited Representatives Defrauding (GUARD) VA Benefits Act, which would reinstate criminal penalties for unaccredited claim representatives who charge unauthorized fees while assisting veterans with filing a claim for VA disability compensation benefits.

Senate lawmakers confirmed 11 senior military nominees that had been stalled for months, putting an end to the nearly year-long political blockade by Senator Tommy Tuberville. When he lifted his hold on 430-plus nominees whom he had blocked due to his objections over the military abortion access policies, he said he would keep his hold on the 11 four-star nominees in a continuation of that protest, but he relented amid additional pressure from Democratic and Republican leaders. The Senate was scheduled to take its holiday break, but Senator Schumer extended the session by a few days to get the military confirmations cleared. If they had not been approved by the end of the month, the White House would have needed to resubmit their nominations in 2024. – Military Times
