LEGISLATIVE NOTES Diane Diekman

Congress passed the \$886 billion **National Defense Authorization Act**, and President Joe Biden signed it, after House and Senate negotiators agreed to drop the proposal to roll back the Pentagon's abortion travel policy. The legislation only authorizes funding and doesn't actually allocate any money. Congress must still enact a full fiscal 2024 appropriations bill. *—Politico*

Congress passed its **third stopgap funding bill** to avoid a partial government shutdown. While it extends Defense Department funding through March 8, funds appropriated for military construction will expire March 1. The cascading effect of short-term funding bills hampers Pentagon contracting on programs ranging from shipbuilding to the beleaguered munitions industrial base. Fiscal year 2024 began October 1. –Defense News

All military services now have regional **special trial counsel offices** up and running, with dozens of specialized prosecutors and support staff to make decisions about 14 major crimes, including sexual assault, murder, manslaughter, domestic violence, and child abuse. Military commanders are no longer in charge of decisions to prosecute these crimes. Only trained, designated attorneys will decide whether to press charges or send a case to trial. – *Military Times*

99th South Dakota Legislative Session

HB-1007 - Changes requirements for employing county veterans service officers. Referred to House Military and Veterans Affairs.

HB-1008 - Modifies eligibility for state veterans home and repeals residency requirement. Referred to House Military and Veterans Affairs.

HB-1068 - Allows disabled veterans to obtain standard, in lieu of disabled, license plates. Passed by House and sent to Senate.

HB-1082 - Changes property tax relief program for disabled veterans/spouses. Referred to House Military and Veterans Affairs.

HB-1101— Authorizes special motor vehicle license plate for recipients of Legion of Merit. Referred to House Transportation.

SB-29 – Allows National Guard members free tuition for private colleges as well as public ones. Referred to Senate Military and Veterans Affairs.
