COMMANDER'S CORNER Dale Hill

I have been re-elected as your Post Commander for next year. Please note the other elected officers listed in this newsletter. Chaplain and Historian positions are still open. Thank you to all who helped make the Post successful this last year.

While membership and recruiting new members are always a top priority to ensure the continued survival of the Legion and Post 15 (we had more than fifty Post 15 members pass away this last year), fundraising is another top priority. The current programs and activities our Post members have voted to support take about \$75,000 per year. Membership dues provide about 10%, pancake breakfasts about 30%, rummage sales about 12%, raffles about 12%, and the rest MUST come from fundraising. We have not yet drawn any funds from the Post account and DO NOT plan to draw on the original amount invested. Our intent is to build this account to a level that most Post activities can be funded from the gains on this account. Our investments are not as aggressive/high risk as some would like. This is the Post's money, and the investment committee must make smart choices. It is not our money to take risks with. There has been no income from our investment in the Alliance, as profits so far have been used to help pay building loans and building maintenance projects.

We need to raise money for funding our programs and activities, while also keeping costs as reasonable as we can. Almost every week, we get requests for financial support that are in line with Legion programs – but many of these are turned down due to Post 15 financial constraints. Last year we sent direct donation requests to more than 200 Sioux Falls businesses, which netted about a 1% response and about \$1000 in donations. We continue to explore additional opportunities but are somewhat restricted by lack of Post member participation. Please help when you can.

There are two main areas of financial need: 1) programs, activities and operating expenses, and 2) increasing the amount in our investment account. If you can contribute an extra dollar or more at pancake breakfasts and social dinners, or make a donation of \$5, \$50, \$500, or \$5000 (or any amount), or make a donation from your estate, every dollar helps.

LEGISLATIVE NOTES Diane Diekman

Congress passed the FY24 defense funding bill on March 23, missing a midnight deadline but staving off a government shutdown. The House passed the appropriations package in a 286-134 vote, with 112 Republicans voting against the measure amid concerns about border security and nondefense spending. Representative Dusty Johnson voted yes. The Pentagon has operated the first six months of the fiscal year under a continuing resolution, which kept funding at previous-year levels and prohibited starting new programs. The budgetary chaos was further deepened by the release of the Defense Department's FY25 spending request on March 11, creating an unfortunate situation in which DoD had to defend its budgetary priorities for next year without knowing what it had for this year. —*Breaking Defense*

American Legion's legislative priorities for action by 118th Congress: Suicide Prevention & Mental Health, Expand research into Alternative Treatments, VA Healthcare Modernization, PACT Act Implementation & Oversight, Safeguard Veteran Benefits and restore criminal penalties for charging veterans to file VA claims, Concurrent Receipt that ends policy of requiring military retirees to forfeit retired pay when receiving disability compensation, Guard & Reserve GI Bill Parity to allow GI Bill eligibility when activated under state orders, GI Bill for Honorable Service to allow veterans with "general under honorable" discharges to receive VA educational benefits, Military Quality of Life legislation, Pay the Coast Guard during shutdowns, Improve access to military Transition Assistance Program (TAP), and Protect the American Flag.

Free Coverage

Members of the LEGION FAMILY (Legionnaires, Auxiliary, Sons of Legion) who are 18 and older are eligible for free insurance from the Legionnaire Insurance Trust. This \$1,000/\$5,000 accidental death policy pays if you are injured or killed while on Legion business. (Carry a membership application with you at all times.) If you are not sure if you are signed up, or would like to register, call 1-800-235-6943 and have your membership number available. It only takes a few minutes. They will not keep calling you.
